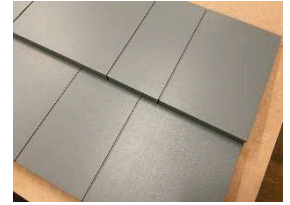




DURATION® EVEN BUTT and STAGGERED SHAKE PANELS

Major Benefits over Individual Wood Shakes:

- As much as 6-10 times less labor (faster install)
- No clearance requirements (e.g. adjacent to roofing material on dormers)
- Very heavy (up to 5/8") butt for great shadow lines
- Impervious to water – won't rot, decay, or be affected by insects
- Can cut a dormer side on the ground and then install the pieces
- Paint ANY color
- Paint will last longer since product is stable and does not cycle moisture
- Requires no back or edge sealing
- Minimal waste
- Environmentally friendly (70% recycled content)
- No cracking, splitting, or tannin bleed
- Class A Fire Rating

Major Benefits over PVC or Vinyl Systems:

- Stable – no gapping or room for expansion and contraction required
- Ability to adjust course heights as needed
- Much more substantial and "real" appearance
- Feel to the touch is authentic
- More environmentally friendly (70% recycled content)
- Unaffected by high heat (reflection of Low E coated windows, etc.)
- Can be painted any color and color can be changed in the future
- Easier to repair or paint in future
